Accreditation Process

NSF grants its Onsite Wastewater Inspector Accreditation once a candidate has successfully passed both a written and a practical examination:

Written Examination

The written exam includes 100 questions focused in a number of onsite topics, such as:

- Terminology
- Calculations
- Conventional and Alternative Treatment Systems
- Dispersal and Disposal Systems
- Inspection Procedures

Practical Examination

Performed at an actual onsite installation site, the practical evaluation includes:

- Inspection Preparation
- Determination of System Use
- Evaluation of the Septic Tank
- Evaluation of the Drainfield
- Inspection Observations and Conclusions

Candidates who pass both examinations will then sign an ethics statement, signifying their commitment to honesty and integrity in their inspection services.
